With more transparency on the current market rates, offering **competitive wages and accurate data** is one of the best ways to make sure you can attract enough job candidates.








Overview of industries in the Charlotte market

Industries we collected data for

We were able to collect data on the following industries: Assisted Living, Catering, Large Venue, Food Service, Fulfillment and Distribution, Hotel, and Manufacturing.

Highest and lowest wages

Average Hourly Wages range between \$15.09 and \$17.60, with the lowest wages being paid in the Manufacturing and Hotel industries, and the highest being paid in Assisted Living and Catering.

Average and Median differences

Average and Median Hourly Wages were close in all industries but Assisted Living and Catering, which means one or more job types are paid lower than the average.



Positions we collected data for

We were able to collect data on the following job types: Bartender, Dishwasher or Kitchen Steward, Sanitation, Line or Prep Cook, Server/Banquet Server, Event Set-Up, Housekeeper, Bindery Associate, and Warehouse Associate

Highest and lowest wages

Average Hourly Wages ranged between \$13.00 being paid to Warehouse Associates and \$17.00 paid to Bartenders.

Average and Median differences

Average Hourly Wages and Median Hourly Wages were close in all job types except for Bartending and Line/Prep Cooks. With the median being higher, it means that one or more employers offered wages significantly lower than the market.

Conclusions

After viewing the Industry and Job Type Average and Median Hourly Wages, we can conclude the following for the Charlotte, NC market in Q1 2022:

- The industries with the **highest hourly wages are Assisted Living and Catering**, with Median Hourly Wages sitting at \$18.
- The industries with the **lowest hourly wages are Hotel and Manufacturing**, with Median Hourly Wages sitting at \$15.
- The **highest-paid job** in the market is Bartender, with an \$18 dollar median being paid for an hour of work.
- The **lowest-paid job** in the market is Warehouse Associate, with a \$13/hr wage.

Hospitality and F&B industries were slightly higher paid than their Light industrial counterparts, with the average median hourly wage being \$16,40 in Hospitality and \$15 in Fulfillment/Distribution and Manufacturing.

Summary

The best paid jobs in Q1 2022 were in the Hospitality and F&B sectors, with Bartender, Dishwasher, and Sanitation being the highest-paid positions. The median hourly wage for the sector is \$16.40.

On average, Light Industrial jobs were paid \$1.40 less per hour than Hospitality and F&B jobs, with the average hourly wage sitting at \$15.00 across the sector.

Average Hourly Wage and Median Hourly Wage were very similar across all job types, with a few exceptions noted in their respective chapters. What these exceptions indicate is that certain positions are either highly overpaid or underpaid due to either lack of information or other differentiating factors.

What we hope to achieve with this report is to **help employers make informed and accurate decisions** on setting wages for hiring workers.
