






Overview of industries in the Miami market

Industries we collected data for

We were able to collect data on the following industries: Catering, Food Service, Hotel, Large Venue, Fulfillment or Distribution, and Manufacturing.

Highest and lowest wages

Average Hourly Wages range between \$11.55 and \$22.50, with the lowest wages being paid in Manufacturing, and the highest being paid in Catering.

Average and median differences

Average Hourly Wages and Median Hourly Wages were close in all job types, which means individual wages assigned to positions were proportionate to their appropriate benchmarks.



Positions we collected data for

We were able to collect data on the following job types: Bartender, Line or Prep Cook, Dishwasher/Kitchen Steward, Barista, Cashier, Server or Banquet Server, Concessions Associate, Housekeeper, Event Set-Up or Houseman, Attendant, Host/Hostess, and Busser.

Highest and lowest wages


Average Hourly Wages ranged between \$14.36 being paid to Bussers and \$25.00 paid to Bartenders.

Average and Median differences

Average Hourly Wages and Median Hourly Wages were close in all job types except for Dishwashers/Kitchen Stewards and Bussers. With the median being higher in case of Dishwashers and the median being significantly lower in case of Bussers, it means that one or more employers offered wages significantly inconsistent with market conditions.

Overview of hourly wages per job type in Light Industrial sector

Positions we collected data for

We were able to collect data on the following job types: Material Handler, Warehouse Associate, and Assembler.

Highest and lowest wages

Average Hourly Wages ranged between \$15.50 being paid to Assemblers and \$18.00 paid to Material Handlers.

Average and median differences

Average Hourly Wages and Median Hourly Wages were close in all job types which means employers are matching market wages closely.

Conclusions

After reviewing the Industry and Job Type Average and Median Hourly Wages, we can conclude the following for the Miami, FL market in Q1 2022:

- The industry with the **highest hourly wages is Catering**, with Median Hourly Wages sitting at \$22.50.
- The industry with the **lowest hourly wages is Manufacturing**, with Median Hourly Wages sitting at only \$11.50.
- The **highest-paid job** in the market is Bartender, with a \$25 dollar median being paid for an hour of work.
- The **lowest-paid job** in the market is Busser, with a \$13/hr median wage.

Hospitality and F&B industries were slightly higher paid than their Light industrial counterparts, with the average hourly wage being \$17.01 in Hospitality and \$16.60 in Fulfillment/Distribution and Manufacturing.

Summary

The best paid jobs in Q1 2022 were in the Hospitality and Manufacturing industries, with Bartender, Line/Prep Cook, and Material Handler being the highest-paid positions. The median hourly wage for the whole Miami labor market is \$16.94 per hour of work.

On average, Light Industrial jobs were paid \$0.41 less per hour than Hospitality jobs, with the average hourly wage sitting at \$16.60 for the Light Industrial sector and \$17.01 for the Hospitality industry.

Average Hourly Wage and Median Hourly Wage were very similar across all job types, with a few exceptions noted in their respective chapters. What these exceptions indicate is that certain positions are either highly overpaid or underpaid due to either lack of information or other differentiating factors.

What we hope to achieve with this report is to **help employers make informed and accurate decisions** on setting wages for hiring workers.
