

With more transparency on the current market rates, offering **competitive wages and accurate data** is one of the best ways to make sure you can attract enough job candidates.



Industries we collected data for

We were able to collect data on the following industries: Catering, Education, Clubs, Large Venues, Food Service, Janitorial, Assisted Living, Hotel, Fulfillment & Distribution, Retail, and Manufacturing.

Highest and lowest wages

Average Hourly Wages range between \$15.00 and \$20.73, with the lowest wages being paid in Manufacturing, and the highest being paid in Catering.

Average and median differences

Average Hourly Wages and Median Hourly Wages were close in all job types except for Clubs and Hotels, in which case a rather large discrepancy is due to one or more job types being paid significantly higher than the sector average.



Positions we collected data for

We were able to collect data on a wide array of positions, with Housekeeper being the lowest paid position with an average of \$14.98 paid per hour of work, and Banquet Captain position being the highest paid, with \$23.00 on average.

Average and Median differences

Average and Median Hourly Wages were highly varied in the case of Cashier, Cook/Prep Cook, Sanitation, and Attendant positions, which means one or more employers were assigning the wages significantly disproportionate as to the appropriate positions.





Overview of hourly wages per job type

Positions we collected data for

We were able to collect data on the following job types: Receiving, Picker, Warehouse Associate, Assembler and Packer.

Highest and lowest wages

Average Hourly Wages ranged between \$15.80 being paid to Utility workers and \$16.85 paid to Receiving Clerks.

Average and median differences

Average Hourly Wages and Median Hourly Wages were close in all job types, which means employers are assigning wages appropriately to the position average.

Conclusions

After reviewing the Industry and Job Type Average and Median Hourly Wages, we can conclude the following for the Columbus, OH market in Q2 2022:

- The industry with the highest hourly wages was Catering, with Median Hourly Wages sitting at \$20.00.
- The industry with the lowest hourly wages was Manufacturing, with Median Hourly Wages sitting at \$15.
- The **highest-paid job** in the market was Banquet Captain, with a \$23 median being paid for an hour of work.
- The **lowest-paid job** in the market was Housekeeper with a \$15/hr median wage.

Hospitality industry jobs were slightly higher paid than their Light Industrial counterparts, with the average hourly wage being \$18.36 in Hospitality and \$16.28 in Light Industrial positions.

Summary

The best-paid jobs in Q2 2022 were in the Hospitality sector, with Banquet Captain, Bartender, and Cashier being the highest-paid positions across the Columbus labor market. The average hourly wage for the Hospitality industry was \$18.36.

Average Hourly Wage and Median Hourly Wage were very similar across all job types, with a few exceptions noted in their respective chapters. What these exceptions indicate is that certain positions are either highly overpaid or underpaid due to either lack of information or other differentiating factors.

What we hope to achieve with this report is to help employers make informed and accurate decisions on setting wages for hiring workers.
