With more transparency on the current market rates, offering **competitive wages and accurate data** is one of the best ways to make sure you can attract enough job candidates.








Overview of industries

Industries we collected data for

We were able to collect data on the following industries: Food Service, Large Venue, Education, Fulfillment & Distribution, Catering, Clubs, and Hotel.

Highest and lowest wages

Average Hourly Wages range between \$14.00 and \$16.66, with the lowest wages being paid in the Hotel sector and the highest wages in Food Service.

Average and median differences

Average Hourly Wages and Median Hourly Wages were very close in most of the presented cases. Median being higher than average means that one or more employers set wages significantly lower than market appropriate, while average being higher than median means that wages were set higher than they needed to be.



Positions we collected data for

We were able to collect data on a wide array of positions, with Housekeeper being the lowest paid position with an average of \$13.52 paid per hour of work, and the Bartender position being the highest paid, with \$17.82 on average.

Average and Median differences

Average Hourly Wages and Median Hourly Wages were close in most of the presented cases. Median being higher than average means that one or more employers set wages significantly lower than market appropriate, while average being higher than median means that wages were set higher than they needed to be.

Conclusions

After viewing the Industry and Job Type Average and Median Hourly Wages, we can conclude the following for the Florida market in Q3 2022:

- The industry with the highest hourly wages was Food Service, with Median Hourly Wages sitting at \$16.50.
- The industry with the lowest hourly wages is Hotel, with Median Hourly Wages sitting at \$14.
- The **highest-paid job** in the market was Bartender, with an \$18 dollar median being paid per hour
- The lowest-paid job in the market was Housekeeper, with a median wage of \$14/hr.

Summary

The best-paid jobs in Q3 2022 were in the Food Service, Large Venue, and Education sectors, with Bartender, Barback/Busser, and Cashier being the highest-paid positions.

Average Hourly Wage and Median Hourly Wage were very similar across all job types but highly disproportionate in Industry breakdown. What these exceptions indicate is that certain job types are either highly overpaid or underpaid due to either lack of information differentiating or other factors.

What we hope to achieve with this report is to help employers make informed and accurate decisions on setting wages for hiring workers.
