With more transparency on the current market rates, offering **competitive wages and accurate data** is one of the best ways to make sure you can attract enough job candidates.








Overview of industries

Industry	Average Hourly Wage	Median Hourly Wage
Caterer	\$19.50	\$20.00
Food Service	\$16.45	\$15.00
Large Venue	\$15.60	\$15.00
Hotel	\$15.56	\$14.00



Industries we collected data for

We were able to collect data on the following industries: Catering, Clubs, Education, Large Venue, Food Service, Fulfillment & Distribution, Hotel, and Manufacturing.

Highest and lowest wages

Average Hourly Wages range between \$15.56 and \$19.50, with the lowest wages being paid in the Hotel sector and the highest wages in Caterer.

Average and median differences

Average Hourly Wages and Median Hourly Wages varied in most Industries. Food Service, Large Venues, and Hotels had significantly higher Average Hourly wages, which means those sectors had jobs paid significantly higher than the market condition.

Overview of hourly wages per job type


Positions we collected data for

We were able to collect data on a wide array of positions, with Line cook/Prep Cook being the lowest paid position with an average of \$14.94 paid per hour of work, and the Dishwasher/Kitchen Stewart position being the highest paid, with \$17.06 on average.

Average and Median differences

Average Hourly Wages and Median Hourly Wages varied highly in most of the jobs on the market. Higher Average wages signify, that one or more employers paid set significantly higher wages than the market conditions demanded.

Conclusions

After viewing the Industry and Job Type Average and Median Hourly Wages, we can conclude the following for the Las Vegas, NV market in Q3 2022:

- The industry with the highest hourly wages was Catering, with Median Hourly Wages sitting at \$20.
- The industry with the lowest hourly wages is Hotel, with Median Hourly Wages sitting at \$14.
- The highest-paid job in the market was Dishwasher/Kitchen Stewart, with a \$15 median being paid for an hour of work.
- The lowest-paid job in the market was Line Cook/Prep Cook, with an average wage of \$14.94/hr.

Summary

The best-paid jobs in Q3 2022 were in the Catering and Food Service sectors, with Dishwasher/ Kitchen Steward, Server/Banquet Server, and Concessions being the highest-paid positions.

Average Hourly Wage and Median Hourly Wage were very similar across all job types but highly disproportionate in Industry breakdown. What these exceptions indicate is that certain job types are either highly overpaid or underpaid due to either lack of information or other differentiating factors.

What we hope to achieve with this report is to help employers make informed and accurate decisions on setting wages for hiring workers.
