With more transparency on the current market rates, offering **competitive wages and accurate data** is one of the best ways to make sure you can attract enough job candidates.



Industries we collected data for

We were able to collect data on the following industries: Food Service, Clubs, Education, Catering, Large Venue, and Hotel.

Highest and lowest wages

Average Hourly Wages range between \$13.90 and \$15.41, with the lowest wages being paid in the Education sector and the highest wages in Food Service.


Average and median differences

Average and Median Hourly Wages were close in all industries, which means employers set the wages close the optimal market wages.

Overview of hourly wages per job type


Positions we collected data for

We were able to collect data on a wide array of positions, with Transportation Spec. being the lowest paid position with an average of \$14.00 paid per hour of work, and the Server/Banquet Server position being the highest paid, with \$15.42 on average.

Average and Median differences

Average Hourly Wages and Median Hourly Wages were close in all job types, which means individual wages assigned to positions were proportionate to their appropriate benchmarks.

Conclusions

After viewing the Industry and Job Type Average and Median Hourly Wages, we can conclude the following for the Tampa, FL market in Q3 2022:

- The industry with the highest hourly wages was Food Service, with Median Hourly Wages sitting at \$15.
- The industry with the lowest hourly wages was Education and Hotel, with Median Hourly Wages sitting at \$14.
- The highest-paid job in the market was Server/Banquet Server, with a \$15.42 average being paid for an hour of work.
- The lowest-paid jobs in the market are Transportation Spec., with an average wage of \$14/hr.

Summary

The best-paid jobs in Q3 2022 were in the Food Service and Clubs sectors, with Server/Banquet Server, and Dishwasher/Kitchen Stewart being the highest-paid positions.

Average Hourly Wage and Median Hourly Wage were very similar across all job types but highly disproportionate in Industry breakdown. What these exceptions indicate is that certain job types are either highly overpaid or underpaid due to either lack of information or other differentiating factors.

What we hope to achieve with this report is to help employers make informed and accurate decisions on setting wages for hiring workers.
